Co-Tutelle PhD Programme in Global Screen Studies Admission Requirements (October 2019 Admission)

Graduate School of Humanities, Nagoya University, Japan and Department of Film and Television Studies, University of Warwick, UK

In collaboration with the University of Warwick, UK, Nagoya University invites students to apply for admission to the Co-Tutelle PhD Programme in Global Screen Studies with English as medium of instruction, according to the terms and conditions below.

Introduction

The Graduate School of Humanities at Nagoya University and the Department of Film and Television Studies at the University of Warwick offer an innovative and collaborative PhD programme that consolidates an existing research partnership and introduces a range of exciting research opportunities for graduate students wishing to work on projects related to the study of world screen cultures.

Students can enrol on a 3-4 year doctoral studies programme at either Nagoya or Warwick and enjoy joint supervision across the duration of their studies with a dedicated year of study and research at the respective partner institution. Students are expected to graduate with one degree from the main university with a certificate from the partner university attached. Students can thus benefit from the dynamic interaction of the existing research and pedagogical strengths in the two institutions with the added advantage of enjoying a programme of study in both East Asia and Europe.

The co-tutelle programme is designed cohesively and collaboratively with a range of benefits in terms of active participation in the wider graduate research cultures of the two universities. They include the opportunity to take part in related MA classes/modules provided by both departments and involvement in the various research talks, conferences and symposia organised throughout the year at Nagoya and Warwick.

It is thus designed to deliver the following objectives:

- A high-quality graduate experience with an international focus
- The possibility of studying in at least two different regional contexts and film cultures
- The chance to carry out a tailored research project that strengthens an intensive understanding of the global nature of screen culture
- The opportunity to collaborate with a range of international film and television scholars with different methodological perspectives
- The chance to develop language skills related to more than one regional context
- The enhancement of future employability skills related to academia and related professions worldwide

Below are the guidelines for students who wish to apply for admission at Nagoya University. For students who wish to apply for admission at the University of Warwick, the guidelines are available on the website of its Film and Television Studies Programme.

I. Eligibility for Application

Those who meet one or more of the following qualifications and admissions requirements for a research degree both (PhD) in the Graduate School of Humanities, Nagoya University, and (MPhil/ PhD) in the Department of Film and Television Studies, the University of Warwick, are eligible to apply:

- (1) Hold a Master's degree or Professional degree from a Japanese university or will receive a Master's degree or Professional degree from a Japanese university by the end of September 2019.
- (2) Have received a degree equivalent to a Master's degree or Professional degree in a country other than Japan or will receive one by the end of September 2019.
- (3) Have received a degree equivalent to a Master's degree or Professional degree in Japan through correspondence education managed by a foreign university or other recognized educational institution or will receive one by the end of September 2019.
- (4) Have received a Master's degree or Professional degree from a university in Japan that is recognized as a university belonging to the system of higher education of a foreign country and is approved by the Japanese Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology or will receive one by the end of September 2019.
- (5) Have completed a course of the United Nations University and have received a degree equivalent to a Master's degree, or will have completed a course of the United Nations University and will have received a degree equivalent to a Master's degree by the end of September 2019. The United Nations University refers to the university established by the United Nations General Assembly's resolution of December 11, 1972. The university is provided for under Paragraph 2 of Article 1 of the Act on Special Measures (Law No.72, 1976) concerning the Implementation of the Agreement between the United Nations and Japan relating to the Headquarters of the United Nations University.
- (6) Have completed the curriculum of a foreign university or educational institution designated under category (4), or the United Nations University, and have passed the equivalent of a Qualifying Examination, or will have completed the curriculum of a foreign university, educational institution designated under category (4), or the United Nations University, and will have passed the equivalent of a Qualifying Examination by the end of September 2019, and therefore recognized as having scholastic ability equivalent to or higher than that of persons who have a Master's degree.
- (7) Have been approved by the Japanese Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology (Ministry notice No.118 of 1989).
- (8) Have been recognized by the Graduate School of Humanities, based on individual eligibility screening for the examination, as having academic abilities equal to those who have a Master's degree or Professional degree, and be of an age not less than 24 years old by the end of September 2019.

Persons wishing to apply under category (7) or (8) in the Admission Requirements must contact the Student Affairs Section for the Graduate School of Humanities at least one month prior to the application deadline and complete the prescribed procedures for eligibility review.

II. English Language Requirement

• A minimum of IELTS (Academic) score of 6.5 and above in all components will be required for applicants with the expectation that they will move to a higher score after the end of their first year of study.

Professor Hideaki Fujiki

Fujiki's research mainly explores the industrial and socio-cultural history of Japanese film stardom and the local reception of American and European films in relation to Japanese modernity; the history of film audiences in Japan, especially social subjectivity and agency the period of the Japanese empire and questions of nationalism, citizenship and transmediality; and ecological issues in contemporary Japanese and other documentary cinema regarding the depiction of radiation, animals, waste, the Anthropocene and the public sphere.

Associate Professor Ran Ma

Ma's research interests mainly concern film festival studies and transnational cinema, with an emphasis on the histories and theories of film festivals, and the independent filmmaking in China, Taiwan, Japan and other East and Southeast Asian countries. She has avid teaching and research interests in Asian cinema and visual culture.

Associate Professor Chikako Nagayama

Nagayama's research and teaching interests include gender, the family and sexuality in society and popular culture, transnationalism in entertainment forms and postcolonial and critical race research in the Asia-Pacific context. Her articles have been published in scholarly journals such as *Signs*, *Transnational Cinemas* and *The Asia Pacific Journal: Japan Focus*.

Associate Professor Shota Ogawa

Ogawa's research explores the interrelations of cinema and modern mobility. His on-going projects include a monograph on travelogue films in imperial Japan and a co-edited anthology, *Routledge Handbook on Japanese Cinema* on Japanese cinema. His writings on Korean diasporic cinema have appeared in journals such as *Screen, The Asia-Pacific Journal: Japan Focus, Journal of Japanese and Korean Cinema*.

Each interview may be jointly conducted by faculty members both from Nagoya and Warwick. Examination may take place via Skype and its schedule will be arranged afterwards.
